

severe: (şiddetli, keskin, ciddi)

- She's suffering from severe depression.
- The US faces severe economic problems.

severe damage: The **blast** caused severe damage to the **surrounding** buildings.
(patlama) (çevredeki)

severe problems/difficulties: The clothing industry has experienced severe problems in recent years.

a severe injury/illness: She had suffered severe head injuries.

severity: (ciddiyet) We didn't realize the severity of her illness.

aversion: (tiksinme, hoşlanmama)

- Most people have a natural aversion to anything **associated with** death or dying.
(ile ilişkili/ilgili)
- I have an aversion to housework.
- **Despite** his aversion to **publicity**, Arnold was **persuaded** to talk to the press.
(Rağmen) (tanınma) (ikna etmek)

interchangeably: (alternatif olarak, birbirinin yerine)

- These two words are almost interchangeable.
- a camera with interchangeable lenses
- For many biochemical tests, plasma and blood serum can be used interchangeably.

prejudice: (önyargı)

- Women still **face** prejudice in the workplace.
(yüzleşmek)
- a cultural prejudice against fat people
- Asian **pupils** complained of racial prejudice at the school.
(öğrenciler)
- For years he has fought against prejudice and racial **hatred**.
(nefret)

based on: (dayanmak, bağlı olmak)

- Their relationship was based upon **mutual** respect.
(karşılıklı)
- an economy based on farming

solely: (only, yalnızca, tek başına)

- **Scholarships** are given solely **on the basis of** financial need.
(Burslar) (dayanılarak = based on)
- If the business is **sued**, the owner will be held solely responsible for any damages.
(dava etmek)
